

Dear all

The new Archbishop of York said this about the impact of pandemic:

"I hate this Coronavirus,

I hate it not only because so many people have died, but because so many people have died alone, unable to hold the hand of their beloved.



I hate it because our health service has been stretched to the limit.

I hate it because so many are bereaved and could not even sit next to a family member at a funeral or embrace each other.

I hate it because children's schooling has been disrupted.

I hate it because so many people are so ill, so many crying out in pain, so many isolated, lonely, fearful, depressed".

But he said he was also thankful for the faithfulness of all who have served others during the crisis and risen to the challenge.

He added: "I am thankful that despite all the horrors of a Covid world we are learning a new commitment to Christ and how to be a humbler, simpler, church; we are putting Christ at the centre of our lives and learning very, very, very painfully what it really means to be a church that is dependent on Christ alone.

Where are you in this?

We all hate the virus and what it has done to our lives and the lives of loved ones. Can you be thankful too for all the good things that have happened in the crisis like the new sense of caring, of community and an appreciation of what we have? We must continue in all this and more. It's Harvest time and millions in our world our suffering hunger and hardship more than ever. So this year our Harvest gifts go to our local Food bank which is so much more used than before and our Harvest collection will be divided between the Foodbank and Tearfund, a Christian relief agency, for their work in Ethiopia providing relief to those without food and water.

And for ourselves we have so much to be grateful for: let's develop an 'attitude of gratitude' to God. We might want to reflect that even before coronavirus

- if you have food in the fridge and a roof over your head, you are richer than 75% people in the world
- if you have money in the bank, you are richer than 92% people in the world
- if you woke up this morning in good health, you are richer than one million people who will not survive tonight.

So please give generously and be content with what you have. Keep saying thank you. "God loves a cheerful giver"

Letter from the Rector about Harvest Festival at St Michael's

Dear all

I do hope you will be able to join us with your family at our **Harvest Festival on Sunday October 4th** at 10.30am. Harvest gifts will be distributed to the housebound, non-perishable items will be taken to the Foodbank and the Harvest collection will be divided between the Food Bank and the Bishop's Harvest Appeal for relief work in Africa.

I can with confidence assure you that Church is a safe place to attend.

The rules about church are unchanged by local lockdown and the rule of 6, since worship is not classed as a social gathering:

"There are no restrictions on public worship, which can continue as at present. Worship is not a social gathering and indeed in this time of national crisis it is more important than ever that Christians are gathering in prayer."

Safety measures we have implemented in Church are:

Everyone sits in socially distanced Household bubbles (only every other pew is in use to ensure a 2 metre distance)

Everyone has to sanitise their hands, give contact details and adults wear masks. There are children's activities during our 10.30 service. If children are using equipment for activities, they will be provided with a bag of their own materials to use.

There is also the possibility to sit outside the church for anyone who does not wish to enter. Our services are now relayed outside and the audibility is excellent. An audio recording of the service and the pew sheet is put on our website each Sunday afternoon for you to listen to if you are unable to get to church. Please let me know if you would value a home visit. There is also the possibility of receiving Holy Communion at home.

I look forward to seeing many of you at Harvest Festival.

In every **£1** we spent, **74p** went on delivering services and making change happen and **26p** went on fundraising.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER NEEDED URGENTLY

THIS IS A LEGAL REQUIREMENT FOR OUR CHURCH

Deadline: Sunday 25th October 2020, the day of the APCM

We have been so blessed for years and years and years(!) with a volunteer independent examiner for our Church books.

His name is Michael Harrison. Unfortunately, due to ill health, he will no longer be able to carry out this role so we are in real need of a new examiner ASAP.

- Are you good with figures?
- Are you a book- keeper?
- An Accountant?
- Are you willing to learn about the Diocesan & Charity Commission requirements

Do you know anyone who might fit with some of the above?

If so, please get in touch with me as the PCC and the all the Church groups really really need someone do to this.

The PCC are responsible for sourcing a volunteer (preferably) but we are also prepared to pay a reasonable remuneration.

There are certain Diocesan & Charity Commission criteria that the successful applicant would need to meet but you do not necessarily have to be a qualified accountant or book-keeper.

A quick summary of the role:

<u>January</u>: I prepare the PCC accounts and gather in all the ledgers and files from all the Church groups.

<u>February</u>: I check through them within the limits of my ability and put together the "first draft" of the reports and accounts for the examiner.

<u>Feb/March</u>: The examiner then checks the figures for accuracy and any anomalies alongside reading the submitted reports to ensure all is clear, accurate and relevant.

This takes about a week (if that) of the examiner's time during this timescale

<u>March:</u> When all queries are resolved, final copy is produced by the Treasurer and distributed.

The examiner checks that all amendments/queries have been answered and signs off the report & accounts.

Job done until next year.

If you think you **might, just possibly might** be able to do this job, or know anyone who **might** be able to do this job – please contact me to discuss.

All enquiries treated as just that, an enquiry, no obligation comes with an enquiry.

The PCC will be asking anyone and everyone they can think of – please help us to meet our legal requirements.

- The PCC could consider a reasonable remuneration
- What you do need is computer literacy using online banking, email, Word and Excel.
- Able to operate a receipts and payments ledger and report back to the PCC on a regular basis
- Produce year end accounts as explained above
- Provide annual statistics return to the Diocese
- A head for figures is also a bonus but my mental arithmetic is rubbish!

Rest assured, any new treasurer would be given full guidance and training with brilliant ongoing support for as long as it is needed!

On why holding an Arts Festival in church is not a good idea

My dear Nephew Darren

Your decision to hold a Summer weekend Arts Festival in church, bringing culture to your inner-city streets, was most commendable. Pity, how it all turned out.

The Friday evening started well with the concert of Scott Joplin piano music. Obviously knowing that the pieces were originally played in seedy bars on pianos wildly out of tune with several notes missing, your committee must have gone to endless trouble to find precisely the right instrument. Your stage-hands, were, however, less careful and hadn't noticed that the platform had a noticeable list to port. After each piece, the pianist had to relocate the piano stool closer to his nomadic piano, with the last piece being performed with both entirely out of sight behind the pulpit.

I am forever proud that our own ladies – through years of experience – can now get five cups of tea from every tea bag and can butter bread so thinly that one pack can last several months.

What you now do with 29 surplus loaves of bread is a problem you have brought upon yourself. You could possibly use them for supporting the stage next year.






