What a wonderful summer we have had for sunshine and warmth, it encourages us all to get out and about to enjoy the lovely countryside around Hoole and to spend time with family & friends.

At St Michael's we were no exception – you can see photos in this magazine of us all enjoying a treasure hunt walk and football match at Picnic Church; always accompanied of course by delicious refreshments. The Sunday School also enjoyed a busy and fun filled party before the summer break.

The highlight of our summer though, was without doubt, the Ordination of our own Mandy Hughes as a Deacon at Blackburn Cathedral on 28<sup>th</sup> June. Mandy was very well supported by her family, friends and a large contingent from St Michael's who attended the service by coach, car and online. At her first service as Reverend Hughes, the next day, Mandy baptised her little grandson Luca Jensen and also received gifts from the congregation. The Leadership Team have all enjoyed some time off with our families and friends over the summer, although work did also continue as usual. Liz Boland, our Children and Young People's Minister, had something of a Busman's Holiday when she and her family went to Lincolnshire to lead the Beach Mission there as they do every year. Liz's article gives us an insight into what this involves.

I imagine many of us have carried or worn a small cross while we have been out and about – for some people it is a reminder to live as Christians, for others a reminder of protection and comfort offered by our faith. Margaret Kirkman gave a moving address in our service on 17<sup>th</sup> August to mark VJ Day, recalling people whose resources (and no doubt faith) were cruelly tested, and she writes about the symbol of the Cross in her article this month.

As we move ahead now into autumn, there is a lot going on at St Michael's. The new term will start at our school with the arrival not just of new children, but a new Head Teacher, Mrs Rebecca Holland and a new Assistant Head, Ms Katy Heyworth. Both teachers will be welcomed with commissioning prayers at our service on 31<sup>st</sup> August which is when Sunday School also restarts.

Reverend Mandy and the Leadership Team will be working hard on planning the next stage of her Ministry at St Michael's and we will keep everyone informed about how things develop. She will be leading more services and our popular Bible Study meetings will restart in September, so do watch out for details. Bishop Joe Kennedy will be returning to lead our services on September 14<sup>th</sup>, when we will also be welcoming two families bringing their children for baptism. Looking further ahead, we will be remembering loved ones in our moving Service of Thanksgiving for their lives on 2<sup>nd</sup> November. We have booked another quiet day at Whalley Abbey on the 15<sup>th</sup> November which is a popular chance for us to reflect, worship and pray together in a beautiful location.

Please do save the dates, in addition of course to Remembrance Sunday on the 9<sup>th</sup> November.

And finally, we extend a warm welcome to Revd David Dickinson who was the Minister at All Saints, Hesketh Bank and upon his retirement he and his wife Gill decided to make St Michael's their home church. Revd Dave has already been leading prayers and assisting at our 1030 service but he has now been given "Permission to Officiate" by Bishop Phillip which means he will be able to preside some services for us - an offer we have been delighted to accept.

Don't forget that St Michael's is open daily for prayer and quiet reflection between 9.30 – 4.30 p.m.





# Here is an extract from Mandy's contribution to Blackburn Diocese coverage of the event:

My journey towards Ordination has been a long one. Brought up in the Church of England, I had a good grounding in the Church before moving around for my career as a Nurse. This took me to experience many different Church traditions and periods of no Church input, as I worked out what it all meant and who I was. I'm not sure if I've got that completely sorted yet!

I lived and worked in Romania for 10 years, am fluent in their language and have a charity that is still operating today. We have been awarded a 'Cross of Nails' for Reconciliation as part of this work from Coventry Cathedral Centre for Reconciliation. As a Nurse and later married to a Priest for 30 years, we moved around the UK. My work as a Nurse and work in Romania - setting up a Charity for health, social, education and reconciliation work - have all been a calling from God and a lifetime of Ministry. Not always easy, especially in Romania in the 90s bringing up 2 small babies/children.

There has been a 'niggle' for many years edging me toward ordination, with people who know me commenting that I'd be a good vicar. After many years of this and living and working with a Vicar husband and becoming a Third Order Franciscan, I gave in and started to explore; firstly, through the Diocese of Canterbury then latterly, after the death of my husband, the Diocese of Blackburn. With a long life of twists and turns, ups and downs, and saying yes to God, the future is exciting and there is more to discover.

### What do you view as your most significant personal achievement?

Apart from my successful bringing up of 2 children and an active part in my grandchildren's lives, my greatest achievement is finally saying yes to God with all my heart. I have many work achievements and they are important to me but my relationship with God is the most important.




# The Symbol of the Cross

Every Christian church you enter will have either a cross or a crucifix on the altar:

- the empty cross to denote that Christ has defeated death for ever
- the crucifix to show that Christ who suffered on the cross is with us throughout our earthly troubles.





It stands as a symbol, as a mark that this is God's house, where all who enter abide by God's teaching and are accepted and welcomed as His children.

We currently have no cross in the Lodge but that is soon to be remedied; as on our new Communion Table, very kindly donated by the Revds Ann & Peter Templeman, we will have a cross made by Wally Taylor which will declare

that our Lodge is also part of God's house.

We all received the sign of the cross at our baptism to welcome us into God's family. Some of our visiting preachers make the sign of the cross when giving the final blessing, to show that all of us are included in the family of God. Some make the same sign when offering communion, showing that these are special gifts blessed by God for his faithful.

Many Christians wear a cross or a crucifix to show the world that they are chosen by God and have themselves chosen to be God's followers despite what the world may throw at them. My cross was bought for me by my husband in Bethlehem many years ago and has only been removed in medical emergencies!!

# So, is it purely a Christian symbol? Well not exactly.

In the Book of Ezekiel, the people of Jerusalem had displeased the Lord so he ordered them to be killed. Some people were grieving for the state of the city and a mark was made on their foreheads to save them from the slaughter. That mark was the last letter of the Hebrew alphabet "Tau," which was then written as X.

Tau is now written as "T" and has become the symbolic cross of the Society of St Francis. Rev Mandy is a member and you may recall that this was one of the symbols we chose for her priesting stole.



In the early days when crucifixion was still a regular form of punishment, the Christian community chose a fish as their symbol. Why a fish?



The Greek word for fish is "ichythus" which is an acronym for "Jesus Christ, God's son, Saviour" - a safe code amongst enemies but still a declaration that you were a follower of Jesus.

Today the cross stands as the symbol of Christ's victory over death, of His continuing love for us, of our delight in following Him and it gives us courage to declare our faith to the world.

We should carry our cross with determination and pride.



Nina Harrison opened the match as the Queen after both national anthems, and a fun afternoon was enjoyed by young and older alike; with craft activities and a short service at half time.





I am perfectly aware that being asked to do anything relating to the job of a treasurer can seem a bit daunting, but let me try and put it in a better light. It has such bad press!

I took on the job of treasurer about 20 years ago.

I had no previous training and learned as I went along with the strong and experienced support of Stan Pickles and John Penrose and I would provide the same level of support.

**Why Are We Asking Now?** Our joint treasurer, Andy Smith has very kindly agreed to carry on in a reduced role until the Spring of 2026, but has been wanting to resign for some months after 4+ years in the role.

It is at this point I wish to thank Andy, most sincerely, for all his support and hard work as Joint treasurer with the book-keeping and also carrying out background research on many aspects of our financial contracts and a wide range of activities outside the financial role.

The other reason is that I have a number of other responsibilities in the church which has always got in the way of me developing understanding of new financial systems that might help to cut workload and increase efficiency. I would love to be able to concentrate on that.

Who/What Are We Looking For? Well, in an ideal world, we need someone a decade or more younger than me (I am 73)!! We need someone who could give us about 4 hours a week to do the day-to-day book-keeping, pay the bills and keep relevant paperwork on file to provide an audit trail. Does that sound better than you thought?

#### What Can I Do to Ease the Process?

I will continue to do the legal stuff, the policies, the processes, the reporting, the year-end accounts, the Diocesan returns and the gift aid and anything else that falls outside the book-keeping remit.

I will be on hand to provide brilliant, comprehensive training and support from the very start for as long as it was needed.

#### The Target Timescale



# **Sutton on Sea Beach Mission**



As the children's activities at church have been having a break over the summer holidays, I thought I'd write about the Beach Mission I lead instead.

Sutton on Sea is a small town on the east coast, just north of Skegness in Lincolnshire. The beach along the east coast is miles and miles of beautiful white sand, and should you wish to, you can walk 16 miles along the coast from Skegness to

Mablethorpe, talking in Sutton as you go, but the beach goes on for many more miles either side of that!

Since 1886, there has been a Beach Mission in Sutton, firstly run by CSSM, and then Scripture Union. There was a brief stop through both World Wars, but otherwise it has run each year, initially for 3 weeks, and now for 2. I have been involved since 1997, and leader of the Mission since 2002. When I first took over as leader, I was the youngest leader on a Scripture Union Mission (I'm very much not the youngest anymore!) and the first female leader of our Mission.

We have a team of about 25 people, this year ranging in age from 17-80, who each pay to serve God in this place each year. We have a great team of people who come back year after year, and in the last 3 years, 6 of our teenagers (including both my children), who have come through the Mission as children, have joined the team. This is a huge encouragement to us and helps us see the huge impact the Mission has on the spiritual lives of young people.



Our day begins with team morning prayers at 8:30, led by me, or one of the assistant leaders, where we look at the same passage as the children, young people and adults will look at later on. On this occasion we were sitting in a bus shape and Bryn has a steering wheel and tickets at the ready! Fortunately, this was our weekly "pray on the beach day" where we are given a chance to take time by

themselves with God to pray, and people often go to the beach. Most days we sat in a much more sensible circle!

We then head to the beach for half an hour of games, followed by our Beach Show. This is an hour of drama, songs, games and a lot of fun. This year, we had over 100 people joining us for this each day, including the first day, when we suddenly had to change our plans and rush to a local church because the driving rain and wind on the beach became too much! Thank goodness for social media meaning



This year, our theme was Uncover, and we were uncovering the truth about Jesus in the gospels in the first week and the beginning of the Church and God's power in Acts in the second. The show was based around a Christian detective agency led by Casey Close and Gil Tee where they solved cases given to them by extra characters; Sir Pent (who tried to persuade them that Christianity was rubbish) and Ant Eek (a slightly batty old man, who had lost something and each day had another clue to help him find it.) They were funny characters who led the show brilliantly.

Each afternoon, we either headed to different church halls around the town for age specific Holiday Clubs or to a local field for activities altogether where we dig into the theme and passage a bit more, with crafts, games, singing, and more fun.

We run Holiday Clubs for everyone aged 0-adults, so everyone is welcome to join us, and the people who come along are a mix of local families; families who come on holiday to Sutton because we're going to be there, many of whom grew up coming to Mission, and want the same for their children, even if they don't go to church at any other point during the year; and people who just find us on the beach and join in. Everything we offer is free, and our income is all from team paying fees and donations from people who come along. Somehow, we always have enough!

The team have a house we're based in which sleeps 11, and everyone else either has their own accommodation if their families are with them, or they stay with local Christians. We take our caravan and sleep in the team house garden!

After Holiday Clubs, the team plan the next day,

before dinner and house jobs to keep our team house clean and tidy. The evenings are either free time, volleyball on the beach, football on a local field or a family treasure hunt in one week, and a barbecue in the other, before team evening prayers and eventually

bed! We work long days (most days I was working before 7:00, and didn't finish until I got into bed at 10ish!) but we love it.

The team contains some of my best friends and very few days pass by on Mission without a lot of laughter being heard from the team house, as well as a lot of support and prayer with anyone who needs it. It is 2 weeks full of friendship, hard work and God.


