

Easter Greetings from the Leadership Team

As the days finally start to warm up, we are looking ahead at St Michael's to some special events around spring and of course Easter.

We started our year with the good news that our Parish Profile, drawn up by the PCC (Church Council), has been approved by Blackburn Diocese, and our advertisement for a new Rector is now live. We hope and pray that the right person will be attracted to lead our active church and develop all the ministry currently being led by our Leadership Team and supported by visiting Ministers. We continue to offer two services each Sunday, at 9.00 a.m. (quieter Communion service) and 10.30a.m (with music and Sunday School), and a small midweek service each Tuesday morning at 10.15 a.m. in our fully accessible Lodge. We also have monthly Family Church services at the Venue, Much Hoole; monthly services at Ribble Court and Old Mill Court; and a monthly Pizza and Praise service aimed particularly at those who enjoy informal worship.

Here are some special dates for your diaries:

We are naming 23rd March 2025 "Spring back to church Sunday". All three of our services that day will be focused particularly upon welcoming people who may not have been to our church for quite some time, and people who may be new to faith. We all know that, if attending church is no longer part of your routine, it can be a bit overwhelming to think about coming back. You might be concerned that you won't know what to do anymore, things have changed, you won't know anybody etc. Please do not let that put you off! St Michael's is a very friendly church, where everyone receives a warm welcome, and those who lead our services will be making sure they explain things as they go along, as well as providing everyone with food for thought. There is lots going on at St Michael's and we hope there will be something that appeals directly to you, wherever you may be in your thoughts about church. We are already looking forward to welcoming you back, so do come along, or bring friends with you if you are a more regular attender.

After that, we will be looking forward to Easter. Archdeacon Mark Ireland will be leading our 1030 service on Mothering Sunday (30th March), and on Palm Sunday (13th April) there will be special activities for the children at 10.30 Sunday School. On Good Friday we will be repeating our popular "Hour at the Cross" services, with a reflective service in church for adults and related activities for the children in the Lodge. Followed, of course, by special celebratory services two days later on Easter Sunday.

The Leadership Team continue to appreciate all the many ways in which members of the congregation are supporting us. It is wonderful to see everyone working together to keep St Michael's thriving as a living church community.



Thoughts on Prayer

Rudyard Kipling wrote – "I keep 6 honest serving men; they taught me all I knew. Their names are What and Why and How and Where and When and Who".

When we start our Christian life – and sometimes even when we think we're well on our way on our journey – we can often be completely at sea, when we try to pray. I've come up with some pointers-not conclusive by any means but maybe a bit of a lifeline to fellow strugglers and stragglers.

WHO - to pray to.

As a child I was taught "our Father", but people leading prayers in Church start with "Dear Lord", "Heavenly Father" "Dear God", or lots of other titles. Any of these will get you tuned into the right wavelength, and you can be sure that God will be waiting patiently and listening very carefully. He really does know this call is important to both of you.

WHERE - to pray

Again, as a child I said my prayers in bed. My lovely neighbours pray before each meal. On Sundays/Tuesdays, most of us go to pray in Church. But you can pray anywhere/anytime. Surrounded by hungry ducks at the Brickcroft, I find is an ideal spot to celebrate God's natural creation. A room filled with friends and family may be a bit noisy but a wonderful opportunity for a moment of thanks.

HOW - to Pray

Again, as a child I was told to be on my knees, eyes tightly closed, and hands pressed together – but one of the most prayerful moments I can remember is walking by a river in the sunshine. I love singing (it will be in tune when it reaches God). Some hymns carry me on a crescendo of glory or an agony of repentance and I am in the presence of the Almighty.

WHEN – to Pray

Again, I was taught morning, evening and Sundays, yet that is not really enough -anytime you are faced with joy or sorrow is right, so that is almost all the time.

WHY – Pray

God loves you and me. God sent his only son to die for us, so perhaps the question should be **WHY NOT?** We all have times when our faith wavers and ebbs, but God is constant, and he wants us to talk with him and to open our hearts to him.

WHAT -to Pray

There is a simple formula called teaspoon prayers (TSP). Thank you, sorry and please. That covers about everything you could think of. There is always something to be thankful for, always something we haven't done right or wish we hadn't done at all, and always something that we want for our world, our friends, family and ourselves.

A little word of warning, there will be answers, but they will be his answers-they will come, but you may need to be patient. So just take a moment from your busy life, and let your heavenly Father help you.

"Rejoice always Pray without Ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you". I Thessalonians 5v16-17.

St Michael's School Governors (where I am vice chair) Leadership Team

The planning, preparation and leading of all these things take up most of my time and of course, extra things such as pastoral visits, baptism preparation for older children and so on.

I think I fit a lot into my 15 hours per week, but I consider it a huge privilege to be able to share God with over 300 children every school term, as well as their families. The lunchtime clubs at school allow me to build up good relationships with the children and staff at school, which is so important. You may look around church on a Sunday morning, and think that if I meet 300 children every term why aren't there more in church? Part of the answer to that is that there is a good number of people who come to Family Church or Pizza & Praise, but not on a Sunday morning. They are still coming to church. I am a great believer in "church" being more than what happens in the building on a Sunday. Every child who takes part in a school Worship, or leaves an assembly thinking more deeply about how they live and how God fits into their lives, is part of our church. I don't do my job to get more people through our church doors (although when they do come, obviously that's fantastic!) but to spread the Good News of Jesus to more people in our community.

I love this job and the joy the children give me. It is what God has called me to do, and in His strength, I aim to do it as best I can.

graph and a coaster with a picture of St Michael's Church superimposed.



St. Michael's Men's Group.

We began 2025 with a visit on January 14th from Mrs Currell from Freckleton, who during World War II was a child attending Freckleton primary school when an American plane crashed on to the school. Many children and teachers sadly died, however Mrs Currell was one of only three children, in the damaged area of the school, to survive the disaster and she told us of her first-hand experience of the happenings at that time and of the aftermath and great care afforded to them by the American forces for many years which followed.

In February one of our own members, Howard Davidson, gave us an insight into his years spent as a prison officer, covering his experiences, some humerous, some less so, and some quite scary and alarming. His illustrations showed the vast area covered by the local prisons of Wymott and Garth and the adjoining land for the new proposed prison as an extension to that site.

Our forthcoming meeting on March 11th will be our joint meeting when we invite the members of the Ladies Group to come along and join us. This meeting will be Part Two of a talk by Mebs Ahmed on his experiences as an Officer in the Lancashire Constabulary. Mebs has given part one of his talk, separately to both the Ladies and Men's Groups, so we felt it appropriate to come together for this, part two of his talk. This meeting is open to anyone and even if you did not hear the first part of his talk, this meeting will still be of interest and can be enjoyed as a stand-alone talk.
