FROM THE RECTORY

Dear all

We were flying to Madeira. The plane was already an hour and a half late. We were nearly there when the pilot suddenly announced that we were going to be circling Madeira for a while as he couldn't see the



runway. Now landing at Madeira required special skills - no ordinary pilot can do it as the runway is very short and finishes at the sea- you have to have special training.. So it was seriously scary to know that the pilot could not see the runway. And we were seriously scared. So we circled and circled the hidden airport for about 45 minutes. Then suddenly we started to descend. We gripped our seats and eventually bumped onto the hidden runway. The whole plane burst into spontaneous applause.

We eventually reached our hotel, more than usually conscious of our mortality. As we entered the hotel, blaring out of the bar was the well known song Knocking on heaven's door which keeps repeating the theme – knocking on heaven's door, knocking on heaven's door. ...as we had been!

Heaven keeps cropping up at the moment. We often just use the word to mean where we go when we die. But the bible passages we have been looking at recently show us that heaven is real now; that behind the scenes of this world there is a much greater reality underpinning and shaping what happens here.

We looked at the famous vision of the disciple John in the book of Revelation. He hears the voice of Jesus inviting him to go through the open door of Heaven. First thing he notices is a throne. John is in the throne room, the control room of the universe. See it like the throne room in the Palace of Versailles where Louis X1V sat and wielded his enormous power over his vast empire Or like the control room of Supreme HQ in World War 11 where the greatest battle in the Universe, the battle between good and evil is managed, fought and won .
