



Spring greetings from the Leadership Team

The weather is finally warming up, and we give thanks for the beauty of the natural world around us in our lovely corner of Lancashire. St Michael's has been a very busy church over the last couple of months, and the Leadership Team have been working hard to provide a good variety of services and activities for all members of our congregation. In March, we interviewed for a new Rector, but unfortunately it was not possible to appoint somebody suitable. We will continue to advertise, but in the meantime St Michael's remains in vacancy and we continue to pray for the right person to apply. We have, however, appointed Mrs Sharon Gregson as our part time administrator — and she has written an introductory article in this magazine. A warm welcome to Sharon who is already becoming a key part of the team.

We held a very successful "Spring Back to Church Sunday" in March, where all three services were aimed at people returning to church after a break, or people newer to our congregation. It has been wonderful to see people being made welcome and encouraged by some of our more established church members, and continuing to come along to learn more about our church community. We also welcomed a lot of families to our Mothering Sunday, Palm Sunday and Easter services, when activities for our Sunday School children proved very popular.

At this time of year, we have also been preparing for our annual church meeting (APCM), when reports prepared by members of the PCC and all the various groups within our church are discussed. This is a particularly busy time, and thanks are extended to several people in particular who have worked hard to prepare for the meeting: our Treasurers, Barbara Wood and Andy Smith, for preparation of the Annual Accounts and approval by independent examiners; our Electoral Roll Officer, Jean Dewhurst, who has been required to undertake a complete review to ensure the roll is up to date; and our PCC Secretary, Andrea Susnik, who has the task of co-ordinating reports, and taking minutes.

We also have two specialist projects ongoing related to church maintenance – repointing of the porch, and renovation of the Carillon Bells, for which Jock Davidson is our hard working co-ordinator.

Looking ahead, we will be holding a special service on May 11th to mark the Anniversary of VE Day. We are also delighted to announce that Bible Study will be re-starting from May 5th when all are welcome to join us in the Lodge for teaching about prayer. Bishop Joe Kennedy, the Bishop of Burnley, will be presiding at a Confirmation Service on June 15th, and we have three weddings and several baptisms taking place in May and June.

June 28th is a particularly special day for us, as Mandy Hughes will be ordained as a Deacon at Blackburn Cathedral, and as part of her celebrations Mandy will lead our service on June 29th, which will also include the Baptism of her grandson.

You will find details of all these events inside this magazine. In the meantime, St Michael's is open daily for prayer and quiet reflection between 9.30 – 4.00 p.m.



The Holy Spirit Comes at Pentecost Acts2 v1-4



"When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages as the Spirit enabled them".

As I write this article, we are still in the season of Easter, which continues until Pentecost on June 8th. We have celebrated Jesus rising from the Dead, and we await his Ascension into heaven (which will be celebrated on May 29^{th)}. This is when Jesus goes up into heaven to sit at the right hand of his Father, until he comes again. In the meantime, he promised he would send the Holy Spirit to strengthen and support the Disciples to do the work he had commissioned them to do – to make Disciples of all the nations.

For the Disciples, this was a time of fear and trepidation. They locked themselves in the "upper" room terrified to go out in case they suffered the same fate as Jesus at the crucifixion. They were told to wait. They had watched Jesus go to Heaven, and having been a bit slow on the uptake, many times when Jesus was with them (they never quite "got" the message that he would not always be with them in bodily form), they didn't know what to do. Does this sound familiar?

However, God promises us the gift of the Holy Spirit, to strengthen us and help us in our daily lives. June is a busy time for me. I will be Ordained (Made a Reverend) in Blackburn Cathedral on June 28th, Bishop Philip will lay hands on me and the Holy Spirit will be invited to send me and others on our way into Ministry, without the Holy Spirit helping us we would not be strong enough in our own strength, to do what God has asked us to do. I can assure you I would be locked away saying -Help I can't do this why me Lord?!! I'm sure we all do the same in challenging times.

But the Holy Spirit is with us always, God the Father, Jesus the Son and the Holy Spirit to help and guide us. We just need to ask. He came as tongues of fire and a roaring wind but we can experience him through the still small voice and the heartfelt knowledge of "God with us".

Come, fill our hearts with power and strength to serve our God in all he asks us to do, and amidst the challenges of life, in the precious name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit Amen **Mandy Hughes Ordinand**

South Ribble Borough Council 50th Anniversary **Volunteer awards**

Added to which, he is the driving force behind the 250 Club, the Local's Lunches, The Domino Drives and the Sunday Concerts: South Ribble in Tune, helping a team of volunteers to provide enjoyable



community activities for all. This particular event also raises money for local and national charities, as well as the village hall. Stan does all these things cheerfully and with good will. When the citation was read out at the awards dinner on 29th March the Village Hall group roundly cheered as he accepted his certificate. The Trustees know how lucky they are to have him on the team.

In addition, Much Hoole Parish Council nominated Richard Lee for the stalwart work he does with publicity, in the promotion of such a lot of these wonderful events which take place locally. He also of course, is a major driving force behind the large annual events, such as the Spring Fair, Classic Vehicle Rally and Christmas Market all of which take place each year at the Village Hall. Having three award winners we were allocated fourteen places in all at the awards evening and were honoured to have the Mayor and Mayoress seated with us at our table, where we enjoyed a lovely meal. There were seventeen winners in all each of which received a framed certificate and a floral gift in the form of a large pot plant or hanging basket. It was good to see that awards were also included to junior sections to recognise the good work carried on by younger members of the borough.

Whilst it was a great honour to receive the awards it was also a very humbling occasion, with the

realisation that we had been selected amongst such a wonderful array of talented and dedicated people throughout the borough. Well done to South Ribble for recognising this and putting on the celebration; and possibly an even greater well done to all those present (and so many others not present) for the stalwart work each and every one is doing for the benefit of others in the South Ribble area.







A friend of a friend of mine has been faithfully praying for me since I first got ill in November 2022. He commented recently that he was still praying, but it was hard when we weren't seeing any answers. This got me thinking about what we expect as an answer from God. Ideally, I would love God to take away my pain and heal my insides fully, but there have been lots of lessons for me from God and answers to prayer over the last couple of years. It's easy to miss them, when we're only looking for the "ideal answer."

Living with chronic pain, especially without a definite diagnosis is not much fun, but I have seen God work in it. I have always been someone who just gets on with things, and someone who finds it difficult to open up to others, but I've learnt to be more open and vulnerable with people; asking people to help, to pray for me and being more open with people about struggles and insecurities.

Perhaps most importantly, I've had to rely on God more. I am fortunate that before all this, my faith hadn't been hugely tested, but I can't do all this on my own, so my prayer life has improved. God has spoken to me very clearly at times, either through things people have said, or directly to me. When I was in hospital for my bowel surgery, I had a very clear picture of God being with me in there and walking with me through it. I have attended hospital appointments where I've specifically asked God for definite answers or plans to come from those appointments, and seen that happen. The answers the doctors have given me haven't always been what I want to hear, but they have been answers that give me an idea of what's happening.

When I had my emergency surgery in the summer of 2003, the timing felt awful, as it meant I missed the whole of the Beach Mission that I lead and have been involved with since 1997, but looking back, I can see God's hand in it - we had just appointed a new assistant leader so my role could be spread out more amongst the team; if I'd taken ill a few days earlier, things wouldn't have been ready or if a bit later, I'd have been a long way from home and so on.

God has given me a very supportive and good GP, and a Consultant who is determined to find out what's wrong, and has gone above and beyond what he needs to do. I am grateful to God for these 2 men who are doing all they can for me.

As a church, you have given me a huge amount of support. I am grateful that God has called me to work in a church and a diocese who are committed to praying for me and support me in tricky times.

These are just a few examples of what I've learnt. I could say more, but whilst I haven't had complete physical healing, I know that God will walk with me for as long as this pain is there. So many times over the past couple of years, I have been reassured of this through Bible verses I've read or things people have said. There are times when I

despair, when I cry out to God, when I lie in bed and cry about it all, and there are definitely times when I wish it would all just go away, but answering the question about answered prayer, has made me think back and find God in the situation.

I wanted to share this, to encourage you to look for the answers to prayer, that may not be the answers we hope for or expect, and maybe "smaller" than we want. God promises to hear us and to answer prayer. I have been greatly encouraged by this verse from Isaiah: "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." (Isaiah 41v10.) As we pray, let's look out for answers and let's look out for how God is working through situations, and let's be encouraged for ourselves and encourage others in what we see.

"The Voices of Morebath Reformation and Rebellion in an English Village" By Eamon Duffy Yale University Press 2001 – Churchwardens' Accounts

Surely, I thought, this cannot be as dull as the title suggests? Indeed it was not and proved to be an interesting and an enlightening read.

Sir Christopher Trychay (priests at that time were often given the title "sir") kept the accounts of his Devon parish from 1520 to 1574, and of the more than 200 sets of Tudor accounts that survive, these are some of the best known and most widely used. The originals are kept in the Devon County Records Office and have been available in print since 1904.

Duffy gives the historical background to the then times of turmoil, and concentrates on changes in the West of England. Quotations are given in Elizabethan English with modern English text. His advice to read the English of Tudor England out loud is certainly good advice.

This work describes the lives of ordinary country people, their births, marriages and deaths and the importance of agriculture – especially the flock of sheep that belonged to the parish, the care of which was shared amongst several families.

Although this was a very difficult and violent time, what particularly struck me was the fact that in the end, the Reformation did in fact settle matters without too much bitterness.

I leave you to reflect on these lines.......

"His traditionalism must of course, have had a doctrinal content, of the kind spelled out in the rebel demands of 1549 – loyalty to the Mass, the ancient faith, the sacraments – but it was before everything else, informed by the genius of place, his religion in the end was the religion of Morebath.

The strength and weakness of such a religion were the same – the local character of its conservatism, the binding of its practitioners to a place, whatever change befell. Not for priests like Sir Chistopher to walk away from the protecting known into the wilderness, undertaken by Protestant Separatists and Catholic Recusants alike, men and women in the pursuit of principle at the cost of the new and familiar. The unthinkable alternative to conformity was to leave his vicarage and the people he had baptised, married and buried for 40 years"

These words have helped me in particular to have a better understanding of the Reformation.
