## **CALLED TO SERVE**



Here is a good quiz question: 'where were Jesus' followers first called Christians?' Answer – in Antioch in southern Turkey. The word Christian means 'follower of the King' – for Christ means the anointed one and only Kings were anointed. As Christians we are all followers of the great King, Jesus the King of Kings, from whom all other kings like Charles obtain their authority.

Many of you will have watched on TV that central part of King Charles' coronation service where he was anointed with oil by the Archbishop of Canterbury. The Archbishop prayed that the oil would be a sign of joy and gladness and that as king, Charles might know the abundance of God's grace. All of us were included in that prayer too.

So it was great that we were able at our civic service to celebrate with joy and gladness the reign of our new King and set his reign where it belongs, under that rule of Jesus the King of Kings.

The theme of the whole Coronation Service was 'Called to Serve' -did you notice how the words 'servant' and 'service' kept cropping up in the Abbey? Charles is called to serve first and foremost Jesus the King of Kings and secondly the people he rules. So we, if we are Christians, share that same calling to serve Jesus the king of Kings and one another.

It was inspiring to have nine community groups in Hoole coming down the aisle in our civic service- Scouts, Little Angels toddler group, WI, Hoole St Michael School, Little Hoole School, Choir, Ladies Group, FOMO, and the Food Bank – celebrating the different ways they serve the community.

It has been great to work closely with the Parish Council and Village Hall Committee in planning the Hoole Coronation Celebrations which began with the Charity Dinner, then the Civic Service and Village BBQ and the local History Exhibition. Let it be the prayer of us all that these wonderful celebrations may prove to be the beginning of a new era of community collaboration and volunteering, supporting especially all children and young people, the elderly and the vulnerable. 



Easter was a very busy time in church for everyone. This is a summary of all that happened for children and families over the Easter period.

#### In School

It was a great privilege to lead an Easter assembly at Little Hoole School, followed by RE with years 1 and 2. In the RE lesson, we walked through the whole of Holy Week beginning with Jesus riding into Jerusalem as the rest of the children shouted Hosanna! We then acted out the Last Supper, the Crucifixion, Jesus' burial (the boy playing Jesus being very accommodating about being buried under the piano!) and finally His resurrection.

The following week, Ann and I were in Church with St Michael's School celebrating their Easter service. Each class took part in the service as we thought about Jesus' death and resurrection and as always, the singing was amazing.

## Palm Sunday



On Palm Sunday, we welcomed Legend the Donkey to our service. The children had a great time riding Legend during Sunday School, as well as taking part in the procession from school to



church at the beginning of the service.

## Good Friday



On Good Friday, while the adults had a quiet, reflective service in church, the children had their own Hour at the Cross in the Lodge. During our hour, we thought about why Jesus died; sung some songs; prayed; had a great discussion about why

we still get punished at home and school if Jesus died to take away our punishments and then made Easter gardens, edible crowns of thorns and Gardens of Gethsemane. We were a small group, but a really important service for our children and young people.





## Easter Sunday

Our Easter celebrations ended on Easter Sunday with our annual Easter egg hunt around the churchyard, and making more Easter gardens, this time with biscuits. A lot of children had a lot of fun as we remembered Jesus being miraculously raised from death.

## Chat & Chocolate Easter egg hunt & quiz



Our older children in Chat & Chocolate didn't miss out on the Easter fun! In our final meeting before the Easter holidays, we had an Easter egg hunt, with an Easter quiz to see how much they knew about the Biblical events around Jesus' death and resurrection. Unfortunately, the weather wasn't kind to us, so we

had to have the egg hunt in church rather than outside, but we still had lots of fun.

## THY KINGDOM COME

Thy Kingdom Come, the evangelistic worldwide wave of prayer which runs from Ascension to Pentecost each year, was born in 2016 as an invitation by the Archbishop of Canterbury and Archbishop of York to churches to pray towards Pentecost. "Come Holy Spirit" was and is the heartbeat of the wave of prayer, Come Holy Spirit so that people who are not yet following Jesus might be touched by his saving love and drawn into being his disciples, finding faith and forgiveness now and the glory of heaven for all eternity.

Thy Kingdom Come isn't confined to any one denomination. Christians in many churches, fellowships and networks across the world join in bringing the richness of their own traditions. Christian leaders from His Holiness, Pope Francis, to many others from denominations and traditions, have welcomed and endorsed Thy Kingdom Come, finding in it the call of God to return to making evangelism the priority.

TKC is an evangelistic world-wide wave of prayer in which we pray that friends, family members, communities and countries may come to know the saving love of God in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Part of our commitment to praying "Thy Kingdom Come" is to pray for five people who do not yet know Christ. We can pray for a few minutes each day for friends, family members, neighbours, anyone we choose. Think of someone on your heart who you long to turn to Christ. You are giving them the gift of life because we know God listens to us when we pray.

We are also encouraged to pray for the nine days between Ascension Day and Pentecost; this is called a Novena (nine prayers on successive days). The Church of England produces a booklet for us to pray daily. We will have these available in Church. The website Thy Kingdom Come also has lots more resources: <u>https://www.thykingdomcome.global/about-us</u>

Paul the Apostle, which means "someone sent", prayed for the Christians in Ephesus (Ephesians) in the bible, Ephesians Chapter 3 and encouraged them; V16 says "I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being. He goes on to say ... that you may have power ... to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love which surpasses knowledge – that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God". This is encouragement to us so that those we pray for can know about how much God loves them, so that we, and they, may live life in all its fullness.

May we all pray Thy Kingdom Come. Amen.

Never in my life have I witnessed crowds this big, and this was an experience in itself.



We were lucky enough to set up on Hyde Park, close to one of the enormous screens broadcasting the whole ceremony.

The atmosphere was incredible: we watched King Charles III being crowned, surrounded by supporters who had travelled from across



Britain and all over the world.

We were able to watch the Civic Service via Live Stream on the train Journey home.

On returning to Preston Train Station we headed straight to the School Field to celebrate 'Hoole St Michael's Church -Coronation Village Picnic' with our friends and family.

The Village Picnic was a huge success, and our prayers were answered with some glorious weather.

A perfect end to an incredible weekend.



## KING CHARLES III

- King Charles III, who was crowned on 6 May 2023, was born at Buckingham Palace on 14 November 1948.
- His Royal Highness was invested as Prince of Wales by The Queen on 1 July 1969. Before the investiture The Prince had spent a term at the University College of Wales at Aberystwyth, learning to speak Welsh.
- Charles trained as a jet pilot prior to undertaking



a naval training course at the Royal Naval College, Dartmouth. This was followed by service on the guided missile destroyer HMS Norfolk and two frigates; Charles became a helicopter pilot and later took command of the coastal minehunter HMS Bronington for his last nine months in the Navy. The Prince followed in the footsteps of his father, grandfather and both his great-grandfathers.

Since founding The Prince's Trust in 1976, using his £7,500 of severance pay from the Navy, Charles has established 16 more charitable organisations and now serves as president of each. Together, these form a loose alliance called The Prince's Charities, which describes itself as "the largest multi-cause charitable enterprise in the United Kingdom, raising over £100 million annually ... [and is] active across a broad range of areas including education and young people, environmental sustainability, the built environment, responsible business and enterprise, and

international." Charles is also patron of over 400 other charities and organisations.

- In 1981, The Prince of Wales married Lady Diana Spencer in St Paul's Cathedral. They had two sons: Prince William and Prince Harry. From the time of their marriage, The Prince and Princess of Wales went on overseas tours and carried out many engagements together in the UK.
- In the early 1990s the couple separated because of their incompatibility and age differences. The Princess was tragically killed in a car crash in Paris in 1997.
- In April 2005, The Prince of Wales and Camilla Parker Bowles were married in a civil ceremony at the Guildhall, Windsor. After the wedding, Mrs Parker Bowles became known as HRH the Duchess of Cornwall.
- Queen Elizabeth II died in September 2022 and the Prince of Wales acceded to the throne. We celebrated King Charles III and Queen Camilla's Coronation on 6<sup>th</sup> May 2023.






