"TO KNOW CHRIST AND MAKE HIM KNOWN"

Dear All

June began with the wonderful celebrations of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee throughout our nation and beyond. Our own celebration service at St Michael's was attended by representatives



of the whole community. At the centre of the service was a Thanksgiving narrative celebrating all seven decades of the Queen's reign. Different members of the community e.g. Parish Council, Bowling Club, Ladies' Group and St Michael's School read out some of the significant events of their decade. Each was punctuated by a resounding Alleluia. We gave thanks for the Queen's personal commitment to God and her selfless service to the nation. We followed the Saint Michael's service by a barbecue in the school and an excellent football match masterminded by Colin Wilson which was a re-enactment of the FA Cup final of 1953. The mayor of South Ribble blew the whistle to start the match and Queen Nina presented the prizes to the winning team.

The rest of June and July was marked by several beautiful weddings including that of Charles and Meghan Redshaw and Michael and Kelly Orritt.

The same theme of new beginnings was emphasised by a number of baptisms including two baptisms of Confirmation candidates by full immersion in a paddling pool in church – a first I believe for Saint Michael's. Baptism by immersion is a wonderful

way to bring out the full significance of baptism. At a Baptism service we welcome people into God's family but we do so after a profession of faith. Candidates who are old enough to make their own vows promise to turn away from all that is wrong in their lives and make a personal commitment to Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour.

Then on 10th July Bishop Tony Porter conducted our Confirmation service – a very significant new start with the Confirmation of five young people and also three adults. You can read their wonderful testimonies about their faith journey later in this magazine.

Alongside all these exciting events we have watched our new Platinum Jubilee Lodge grow dramatically before our eyes. We are assured it will be ready to be opened and to use from the 18th September. Archdeacon Mark Ireland who suggested the Lodge in the first place and has been very supportive throughout will be speaking at our special celebratory service at 10.30am on 18th September. He will then formally open the lodge. There will be refreshments and then a parish barbecue to celebrate this significant New Beginning for Saint Michael's church. At last we will have a building to accommodate our children's and young people's work during the service on Sunday and also house a variety of activities and events throughout the week e.g. Bible studies, Baptism preparations, Church Council meetings Bereavement teas, Mums and Toddlers' etc.

At the time of writing we are at the very exciting stage of planning our autumn programme: we hope to hold an Alpha course on Wednesday evenings in October and November to which every member of the local community is warmly invited (see article). Please consider whether you would like to come along: you can just dip in and try one session – the 30 minute films are very excellent.

It will be a great way to meet people and to go deeper into the Christian faith.

A huge thank you to all those groups and individuals who have contributed thus far. See Jane Elphick's article on about what else is needed at this stage.

We are all very conscious that all these exciting new developments will only thrive if everything we do is underpinned by prayer. So please pray. It is God's work we are engaged upon and we need to stay close to Him as we strive to live out our aims – TO KNOW CHRIST AND MAKE HIM KNOWN.

We plough the fields and scatter is one of the great Harvest hymns. All the good gifts we have come from God, and at Harvest particularly we focus on thanking Him for all his generosity of love. But we all know true thankfulness must be demonstrated in our lives as well as on our lips

So this year our Harvest Festival service on the 2nd October will also be a '**Gift Day**' when all of us are encouraged to consider prayerfully our giving, and pledge anew to give to the work of God's kingdom here in Hoole.

We are at a very exciting time in the life of St Michael's and have been greatly blessed in many ways this year. Our new Lodge is nearing completion, which will transform the way we do our children's work on a Sunday and provide all sorts of opportunities to reach out to the community. We have seen many new adults and children joining our worshipping congregation over the last year and we long to welcome many more. For all this we need resources.

We have received many generous gifts towards the Lodge, but regular giving, which we need to pay our bills, has not yet returned to pre-Covid rates and we urgently need to increase our current monthly income to do so.

The PCC is therefore inviting everyone who attends St Michael's or regards St Michael's as their church, to consider whether they could increase their regular monthly giving or perhaps begin to commit to giving on a regular basis if they don't currently do so.

There are 3 areas which urgently need resourcing and we would like you to pray about whether you could pledge to give to one or more:

- The Lodge: we have wonderfully raised most of the money needed for the actual building, but we now need to equip it for all the church and community use we have planned;
- 2. Our biggest monthly expenditure is paying for our young people's minister. Could you contribute on a regular basis or a one-off gift specifically to our children and youth ministry?
- The church general fund which covers all the expenditure on maintaining the church and its ministry.

At our Harvest Festival on the 2nd October we will be inviting people to hand their pledge in a sealed envelope. Please start praying now about what God wants you to give.

UPDATE 3

7 August 2022

Since the last issue of the magazine, building on the Platinum Jubilee Lodge is happening at a rapid pace.

The original stone has now been re-built as a feature of the Lodge wall.

Construction of the brickwork is at a point where the stone sills are required which have now been delivered. Windows are in the process of being installed and the screed flooring will be laid next Wednesday. The slate roof can be finished once brickwork has been completed. Plastering and second fix will commence in the coming weeks.





The trench from the Church to the Lodge for utility supplies (i.e. water / electric/ internet) has been dug, laid and refilled, which Harry Sutton's Team have done a remarkably neat job.

OUR PLATINUM JUBILEE LODGE IS NEARING COMPLETION!

Thanks to many generous donations from local organisations, Blackburn Diocese and individual supporters, the building of our lodge is continuing rapidly, and we are planning a grand opening on September 18th 2022.

However, we are now working on fitting out the inside of the lodge to ensure it can be used flexibly for our children's work, but also for adult and social meetings. We need your help to do this.

Several people have said that they would prefer to make donations towards a specific item, rather than donating into a general fund (but you can choose your preference: general or specific). Here is your chance to do so!

We already have some items, but you will see below a list of others we need, with a rounded costing. If you feel able to donate you don't have to buy the item – we will do that – just let us know what you wish to buy and arrange to transfer the appropriate amount of money.

A donation of £10 could buy any of the following: dustpan and brush, doormat, cleaning products, washing up caddy, toilet roll holder, toilet brush.

A donation of £20 could buy any of these items: small folding tables, mop and bucket, coat hooks, waste bins, wall clock.

A donation of £25 could buy a chair for a child.

A donation of £30 could be used to buy a mirror for the toilet area, a baby change unit, or window blinds.

A donation of £45 could buy a chair for an adult.

A donation of £50 could buy us a computer desk or a bracket to mount the TV.

A donation of £150 would buy the fridge or children's work table we need.

A donation of anything at all could go towards buying teaching aids for our children and young people's work and adult discussion groups. These will include DVDs, books, craft materials, stationery etc.

If you feel able to make a specific donation, thank you so much. If you feel able to make a general donation, thank you so much. There are three ways to donate:

Place your gift in an envelope at the collection on our Harvest Gift Day on 2nd October, clearly marked with your wishes.

Place your gift in an envelope at any time, clearly marked with your wishes and give to the churchwardens.



TO ALL SPONSORS OF THE FLOWER FUND

(past, present and future...)

As many of you will be aware by now, the PCC, in consultation with the Flower Fund Committee, made the decision in March 2022 to amalgamate our church bank accounts.

This course of action was taken for three reasons:

In November 2021 our bank (HSBC) and many others started to apply bank charges for all cash and cheque transactions

Prior to that, we were strongly advised by the Finance Director of the Diocese of Blackburn that all funds raised for the benefit of the church should be in one account

As a charity with excepted status, we are having problems finding a new bank that does not apply charges because we are not a registered charity so combining the accounts reduces costs quite effectively.

We are encouraging as many sponsors and donors as possible to convert from cash or cheque donations to one of the following:

Standing Order (via online banking or a manual instruction to your bank – I can supply the form you need)

Online bank transfer (BACs)

Many of you have already responded to my email or letter and converted to one of the above, for which we thank you very much.

If you currently donate via one of the above methods to the Flower Fund bank account and we have not managed to make contact with you, please can you contact me as a matter of some urgency so I can provide you with the information you need to continue donating to the Flower Fund.

In the meantime, can I give ALL sponsors and donors this reassurance –

If you wish to continue to donate via cash or cheque, that is absolutely perfectly fine, we understand that online banking is not for everyone.

It would be very helpful indeed with the efficiency of our administration and book-keeping of this RESTRICTED fund, if you could contact me and let me know your decision so I can update our records.

The Flower Fund bank account will be closed by the end of August but, rest assured, it will still live on within the Church accounting systems as a separate RESTRICTED fund, the content of which will be used solely for the decoration of our Church.

No donations will go in general church funds. I guarantee it.

UKRAINE PARTNERSHIP – ALL SAINTS CHURCH, PRESTON

Through partnership with churches and individuals across the UK and alongside the Government's 'Homes for Ukraine' scheme, members of All Saints Church in Preston have had the opportunity to help some of our brothers and sisters from Ukraine in a very practical way by providing homes and support to a number of Ukrainian refugees since May. Their aim is to continue to finance and care for these people for as long as necessary given the ongoing uncertainty in Ukraine.

At present there are 38 men, women and children being sponsored by the All Saints church family in Preston. Many of those joining them are members of Kharkiv City Church, a church plant which began in 2019, involved in reaching out to those in need in built-up areas in Kharkiv; the majority of their Ukrainian friends joined us having fled Ukraine as the war began in February 2022.

The initial group travelled by car and then by foot from Kharkiv to Romania and then on to Hungary over a couple of weeks. Wonderfully the Lord sustained and protected them as they travelled nearly 2000km to Budapest, all while awaiting visas to enter the UK. Christians throughout Ukraine, Romania and Hungary opened their homes and served them as they travelled.

The All Saints family are so thankful to be able to partner with them now they have arrived in the UK, and to have welcomed others who have arrived from other parts of Ukraine. 


St James the Least of All
