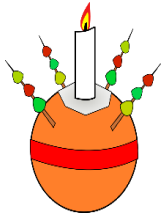

We are gathered here today to remember before God those from Hoole who gave their lives in 2 World Wars and in conflicts since that time. We are here to give thanks to God for the courage and self-sacrifice of those who died and those who remember them. We come also together conscious of our need for God's forgiveness for the sin and the desire to dominate others that leads to conflict between people, and war between nations. And as we remember the many soldiers, sailors, and airmen who gave their lives restraining evil and opposing tyranny, so we also come in thanksgiving for the peace that the nations of Europe have enjoyed since the Second World War. But above all things, let us pray that God's will may be done on earth as it is in heaven, as we join our voices together and say:

**THE LORD'S PRAYER:**

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy name;  
thy kingdom come;  
thy will be done;  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass
